**Sanctuary House** provides homeless families and individuals with shelter while helping to move them into permanent housing.

**Women's Place** provides shelter for single women and women with children.

### **Meal Programs**

Senior Center programs located throughout Monroe County serve residents age 60 and over. All offer a nutritious meal and many have a complete calendar of recreational, cultural, educational, health and social services programs. Transportation services are available at many programs. There are several meal programs available for mature adults in Monroe County.

The Lunch Club 60 Program is a congregate meal program for persons with 60 or more years of age and is administered by the Monroe county Office for the Aging.
