Program Information Session Module Three of Three

How Am I Notified of a Decision?

Once you have completed the application process you will be sent one of the following three letters or emails:

- **Acceptance Letter/Email**

You have met all the application requirements and have been selected for the program. It will tell you your next steps.

- **Non-Select Letter/Email**

You have not met all the requirements and/or have not been selected for the program.

- **Waitlist Letter/Email**

You have met all the requirements. We do not have a seat available at this time. We will contact you if a seat becomes available. (Important that contact information is updated.)

Barriers to completing your program or receiving a license

- **Termination from a clinical site**
Students who are terminated from clinical site will not be able to complete their program. Clinical is required to satisfy the NYS requirements.
- **Delinquent/defaulted student loan**
Students who have outstanding prior student loans will need to make arrangement to bring your loans into good standing. NYS will not issue a license to applicants if in arrears or possess defaulted loans.
- **Arrears in child support**
NYS will not issue a license to applicants who are in arrears for child support. You will need to bring your account into good standing or make suitable arrangements.
- **Other legal issues***
If you have pending legal issues and are unsure if this status may affect licensure, LawNY can help.

Take a moment and think...

Is this the correct program for me right now?

Ask yourself

- **Do I have the time to put into successfully applying myself to and completing this program?**
- **Can I handle the demands of a fast-paced and stressful environment?**
- **Can I handle the physical demands of this program?**
- **Can I handle the emotional demands of this program?**
- **Have I put all my commitments in order?**

If you have decided this is not the right time for you to start the REOC LPN program...

Don't get discouraged – try again next year.

- **You can apply for the LPN Program next year.**
- **This may provide you more time to organize and get things in order.**
- **Think about what you can do in the meantime...**

If the REOC LPN program is not right for you or you need time to get things in order...

What are some options?

- **Take another REOC program**

You may be able to apply for another healthcare program and transition up to LPN next year or in the future. This allows you to gain experience in healthcare, earn money while you wait, and better prepare you for training to become an LPN. (You must work in the vocational field in which you were trained for 12 full months before you are eligible to apply for another REOC program.)

- **Take classes/programs in REOC ATTAIN**

Build your resume with computer-based courses and programs to sharpen your skills and study habits.

If the REOC LPN program is not right for you or you need time to get things in order (continued) ...

What are some options?

- **Explore college**

Maybe college is the right step for you. REOC's College Connections can assist you in exploring college options and taking that first step to college.

- **Take classes/programs online**

Through "SUNY for All" there are many classes and programs all across New York State that you may be eligible to take. All on your time and on your schedule.
